

SENIOR PROJECT FALL 2018

Senior Project is a **NON-CREDIT** bearing course that provides an opportunity for students to showcase the knowledge, creativity, and skills developed as a result of their twelve years of educations. Through the Senior Project experience, students focus on individual and special interests and are held accountable for their own learning. This is a pass or fail class.

Individuals agreeing to serve as mentors are required to sign the Mentor Form (Exhibit B).

****Faculty/School Board Employee** agreeing to serve as mentors must first sign the Faculty Agreement Form (Exhibit C).

All mentors must fill out the Off/On Campus Agreement (Exhibit A). Exhibit A must be filled out by the student, the student's parents and the Mentor they will be working with for the Semester.

EXHIBIT A: Senior Project Agreement On/Off Campus Credit – this has to be signed by **ALL** parties and turned in at the 2nd Turn in

EXHIBIT B: Senior Project Mentor Agreement – this has to be signed by the person/mentor you are volunteering for – **THEY DO NOT WORK AT THE SCHOOLS** – turn in at the 2nd turn in

OR

EXHIBIT C: ****Senior Project Faculty/Sumner County Employee Agreement** - this has to be signed by the teacher or staff employed with **SUMNER COUNTY SCHOOLS** – turned in at the 2nd turn in

EXHIBIT D: Mentor Evaluation of Senior Project – signed by the person/mentor you are volunteering for – **ONLY ONE SHEET TURNED IN FOR EACH TURN IN**

EXHIBIT E: SENIOR PROJECT TIME/JOURNAL SHEET - *****one for **EACH** week – signed by the person you are volunteering for/mentor - *******TOTAL THE HOURS FOR THAT WEEK** – some weeks you will turn in 3, 4, 5 or 6 time sheets – **THE JOURNAL SHOULD BE FILLED OUT BY THE STUDENT AND NOT JUST A FEW SENTENCES** -

EXHIBIT F: Student Evaluation of Senior Project – This will be turned in at the **LAST** turn in and also signed by the person you are volunteering for/mentor.

EXHIBIT G: Summative Mentor Evaluation of Senior Project – This will be turned in at the **LAST** turn in and also signed by the person you are volunteering for/mentor.

On average, students will participate in Senior Project activities 7 hours per week. At the end of the semester, the student should have accumulated approximately 110 hours on their project, kept a weekly journal of activities, met with their faculty advisor, and submit mentor evaluations. The academic or instructional activities may take place on or off the WHHS campus.
